Improvement Plan priorities

We have just evaluated our improvement plan and created our new objectives for the next academic year.

We will be focusing on:

- Learning, Teaching and Assessment
- Developing an enabling environment
- Building a Team
- Building relationships to support transitions.

Covid

A parent has enquired if we would inform everyone if we had a covid outbreak. We will email to let everyone know in-case families have vulnerable family members. If you do not receive a call informing you that your child has to self isolate, it means it has not affected their bubble.

S.T.E.M grapt

We applied for a S.T.E.M (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) grant. We just found out we were successful! The grant will be focused on building relationships with local centres and schools. We will be booking training for our staff and other school and other nursery staff in woodwork. This will then become the focus of transition visits through the year from November—June.

This project will build positive relationships with school staff and children that will be attending the same school as your child who is based in another centre. The hope is that children will have a broader friendship group when they start school.

As Oakburn is very outdoor focused , we are keen to develop our staff skills in woodwork that can be shared with the children.


Family photo's

Makaton

We have introduced 'please' and 'thank you' in a makaton. The children are becoming very good using the signs at snack and lunch time. We have just introduced 'hello' and 'goodbye'. This supports children's communication skills, particularly for children where language is just developing.



During the holidays the children will be learning some Makaton songs.

Sup Safety

As we welcome the lovely sunny weather, we are also aware of the damaged this can have on your child's skin. Please remember to apply sun cream to your child before they attend nursery and let staff know during drop off.

Our staff will re-apply the sun cream as and when required, as well as ensuring your child stays hydrated, however we do ask that you apply the first layer of sun cream and provide appropriate clothing for the weather, including a sunhat.

We apply Aldi's own sun cream if you have any worries about this, please discuss with a member of staff, as soon as possible.
