Two parents per day can book in with the office to have a 10 minute walk round. Parents must wear masks and maintain social distancing. We cannot allow parents into the playrooms at this time. Parents can also stay with their child for their first settle in the outdoor area. Thereafter, we must revert to staged settles with parents leaving children for short periods in the centre. Seed to Table

We have been developing our Oakburn mini allotment in our nursery garden. We have started by planting potatoes and discussing the process of what we needed to make them grow.

We looked after our potatoes making sure they were watered and watched them grow. When the leaves on the stocks began to wilt we knew our potatoes were ready to be picked.





We harvested the potatoes ready to be cooked in different ways to have for us to taste what we had grown. We cleaned, chopped and cooked our potatoes discussing different things we could make with the potatoes.





We made potato salad and homemade chips. We enjoyed trying the potatoes in different ways and were so proud that we had grew them ourselves.





We look forward to our next growing project at the Oakburn allotment.

Sports Programmes

After September weekend we will be starting some of our sports programmes to support Health and Wellbeing. These include:

Play on pedals— This is a bike riding programme which focuses on developing balance and control of a bike through fun and imaginative activities using a balance bike. Also the children learn about parts of a bike, how to fit a helmet correctly and the basics of how to look after their bike.

Wake and shake - This is a dance programme will be run in both morning and afternoons. This programme is a fun way to promote physical activity by giving the children opportunities to dance to different music and dance routines.

Parent drop in with management

We will be hosting regular drop in meetings with the management team and other staff members.

Our next drop in session will be on Friday 1st October @ 10.30am Kirsty, Erin and our nursery teacher will be hosting a meeting to discuss our PATHS group and what this involves and discuss our Literacy programmes—Word aware and Author of the month and how this will look in terms of learning teaching and assessment.

PATHS Group



Makaton

We have introduced 6 Makaton signs which we are now revisiting. We have learned 'Hello' 'Goodbye' 'please' 'thank you' 'more' and 'snack'. The children are becoming very good using the signs at snack and lunch time. This supports children's communication skills, particularly for children where language is just developing.





Author of the Month & Word Aware

As part of our literacy programmes, in September will be starting our Author of the month. Throughout this we will be focusing on book handling skills, discussing the names of the parts of a book such as: the front cover, title, author, illustrator, blurb etc. We will then get the children to select their favourite story from the Author and write a review.

The first Author we will be exploring is Oliver Jeffers - We will be reading Lost and Found, How to catch a star, The way back home, The incredible, Eating boy and Stuck.

<u>Word Aware</u> - As part of word aware we will select a WOW word from one of the books as part of author of the month.
