Allergies -

Allocations—Deferred Entry

Deferred entry applications for any children deferring entry from school go live on the EDC website on 6th December - 31st January. We will be sending out an email giving more information regards to who can defer and the process. If any parents have any questions or would like to discuss this with your child's key worker or nursery teacher. If you are deferring your child, you would still have to register your child for school (at their catchment school) as well as a deferred entry application for early years.

Allocation news

Returning 3 & 4 year olds - Any returning 3/4s (who's DOB falls between March 2018—February 2019) - do not need to re apply again. Erin will email and ask if there will be any changes to pattern for returning year - if yes, you will fill out an alteration form to change the pattern. If no change to pattern is needed—this will stay the same. Erin will send out more information about this on the email prior - any questions see Erin our Depute Head of Centre.

New 3 & 4 year olds - This includes any child who's DOB falls between March 2019—July 2019 and any 2 year old who turns 3 between August 2022 - July 2023 should apply for your 3 year old place. These applications will go live online from January 7th - 28th February 2022.
